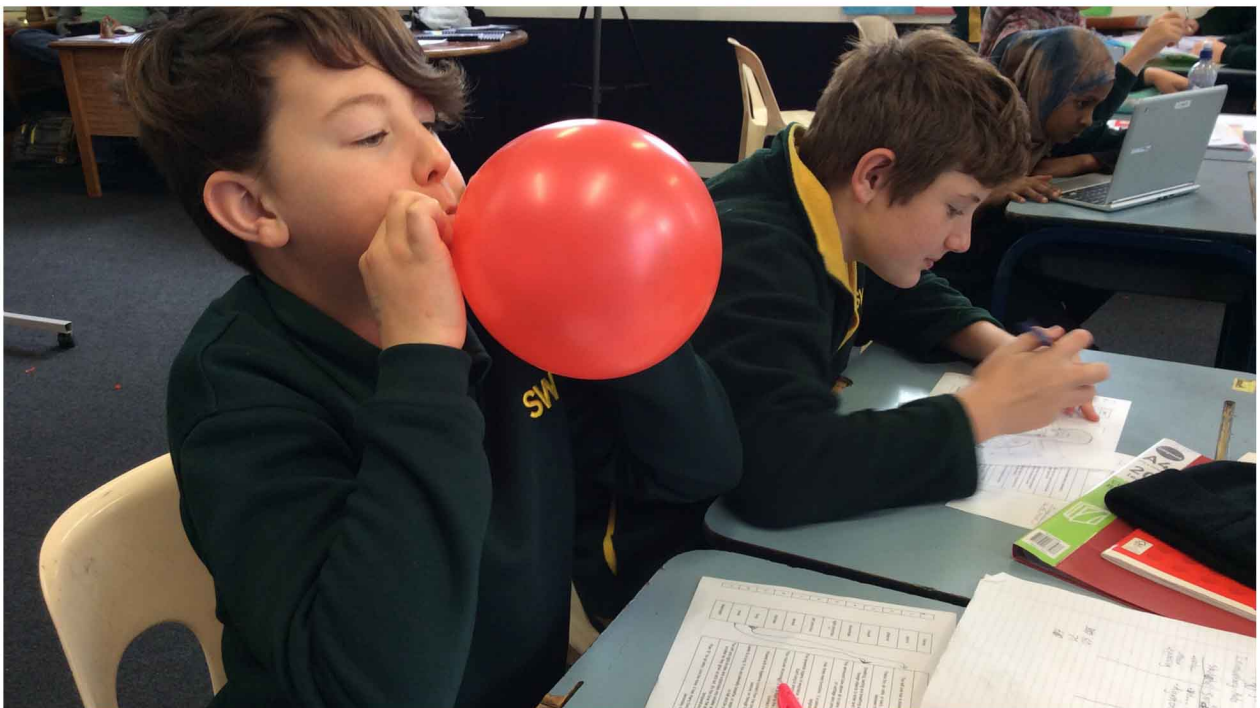

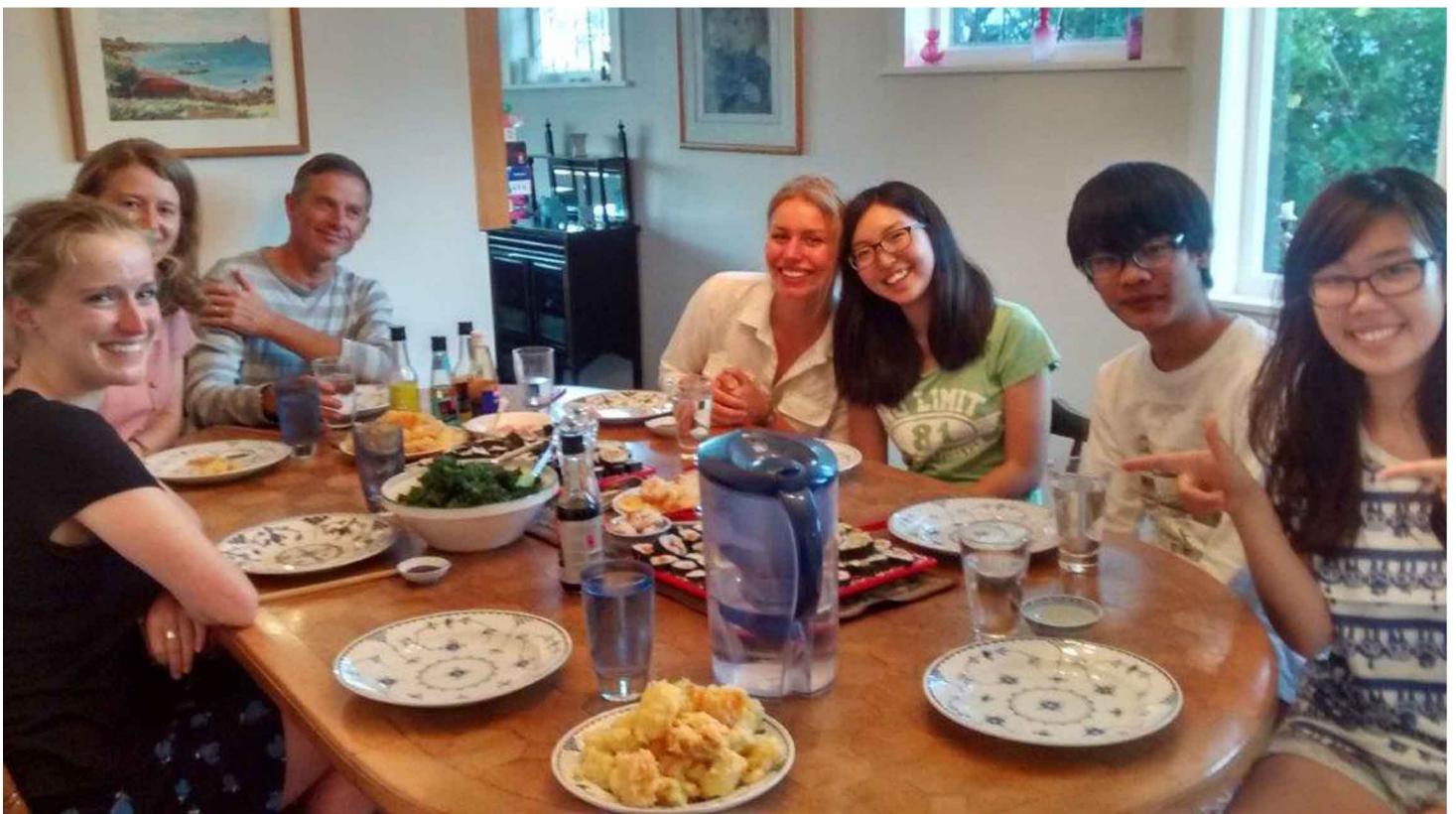
LOOKING AFTER YOUR CHILD
